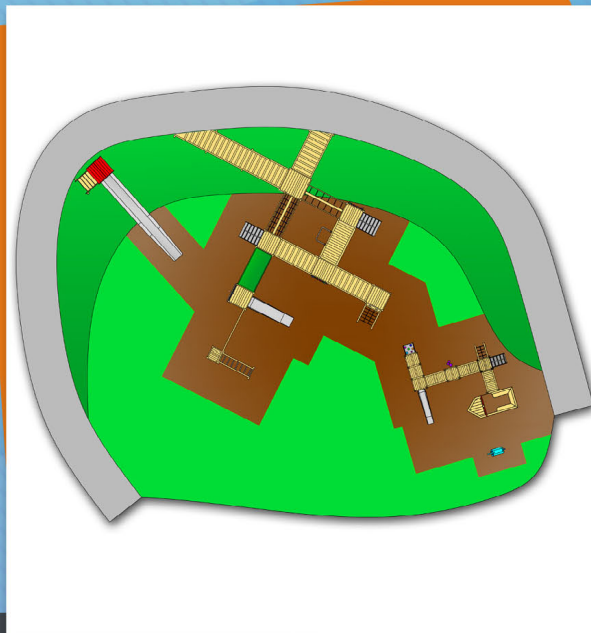

Being steeped in history, the town of Wadebridge sparked many exciting ideas for their revamped play area. Ideas discussed included the Camel Locomotive, and the Camel River but the final design represents both the fishing port of Padstow and the bridges of Wadebridge town.



Design it

Accessibility by all was paramount in the design. Wadebridge Towers are linked to the path at the rear with wheelchair accessible bridges and incorporate the natural grass bank. The raised position allows for stunning views over the Camel River which passes along side the play area.



Build it

We can incorporate as much or as little theming and colour into our play areas as our customer's desire. Our timber equipment blends perfectly in to it's surroundings, but with the simple addition of some colourful panels, we can produce an area that really stands out from the crowd.
